

2 VISUAL IDENTITY

2.1 Project Logo

2.1.1 Logo concept

This logo uses the project name **SERENDI-PV** (which is an abbreviate of the project title **Smooth, Reliable aNd Dispatchable Integration of PV in EU Grids**) as the text of the logo. The two-thirds multicolored circle serves two purposes, first, to represent the Sun and irradiation, the main power source of PV technology. Second, the symbol also attempts to simply visually the very complex topics within the project. This symbol will often be accompanied by further visuals that portray the project more literally, these visuals are shown below in section 2.2.

Beyond the high aesthetic quality displayed in the logo, there are also a number of practical reasons why this logo was chosen, including:

- Readability and ability to stand out in different contexts (e.g. colour, black & white and negative versions);
- High performance both in small and large dimensions;
- Potential to evolve into other graphic materials (e.g. a graphic layout for brochures, leaflets, newsletters, website that are clearly inspired by the logo.); and
- Clarity in delivering the contents of the project.

The full logo above and the accompanying visuals use the following colours. The future website and all future dissemination and communication items will use the following colour pallet, in order to create a coherent visual identity.





Figure 1.3: SERENDI-PV logo colours




Figure 1.4: SERENDI-PV accompanying visuals
